12th BuSho is here!

The 12th BuSho International Short Film Festival has begun, after addressing the audience with a few welcoming words, Tamás Gábelyi festival director gave the floor to the moderator, Barnabás Szabó Sípos and Anna Sólyom, interpreter. Even though we are set upon avoiding the image and atmosphere of a red-carpet festival, Barnabás Szabó Sípos honoured the 12th edition by sporting a nice necktie. Puskin Cinema, our main venue for the third time, celebrates its 90th birthday in September. The repeated screenings will be held at the new Corvin Club. Our old venue, Vörösmarty Cinema is back with the name of Örökmozgó. The magnitude of the festival is characterised aptly with the number of the entries (more than 1200) and the applicant countries (78). The pre-jury took two months to select the best 74 films of the competition programme.

The festival was opened by Wolfgang Leis permanent jury member, with the following words: "I have the honor to open the 12th Busho Budapest International Short Film Festival. Although BuSho is characterized by continuous development, we want to avoid at all costs turning into a faceless red-carpet festival. Last year we saw Syrian refugees passing by the Puskin cinema, and it was an event without precedent in the life of the festival. Although – according to statistics the number homicides has decreased in the past decades- media outlets focus mainly on terrorism and war projecting a world view according

to which our lives are getting more and more endangered. This situation provides an opportunity –but also an obligation- for film makers: to counter-balance the fear-mongering media outlets and to convey humane values like: understanding, respect, empathy, knowledge. This should be the aim of BuSho as well: to inspire each other and to co-operate for the formation of an increasingly civilized global community. "

Interview with Wolfgang Leis

We all know that you've been a jury member since the first BuSho Festival. Tell us a bit about the beginning of all this.

It all started a long time ago, when I first visited Hungary. I loved everything about it: the people, the city, the climate, the mentality... So I happened to meet Tami back in 1993. Tami told me about a short film festival which was terrible in every way: the organisation, the films, the venues, and even the beer!

Then he told me: I will organise a film festival, and I can do better than this! Can you help me? - It all started like this...

I liked his attitude and his way

of thinking: he wasn't just complaining about the things and telling what was wrong, he wanted to show that he can do better. He asked me if I could help in this, and I couldn't refuse him.

You are a business consultant and involved marketing in your everyday life, how come that you're a jury member at a film festival?

For me, BuSho is a part of my summer vacation and I enjoy the fact that I can do something else. When I started all this, I didn't even know that I actually really like short films. I don't like long films, where you have to wait like 90-120 minutes for the plot to unfold. It is much more interesting and exciting when a film is only 5-10-15 minutes. Although we watch a huge amount of films here, but the variety is huge and the time passes by really fast. Different topics, different people, different worlds every time. I like this.

Interview with Christian Inaraja Genis, jury member

We had a pleasant talk with the international jury member, Christian Inaraja Genis from Catalunya, co-director of the FEC Film Festival. His partner, Sylvia Ferran was also ready to answer a few questions.

As you are an illustrator and currently a jury member of a film festival, we are interested in the transition from one genre to the other. Could you please elaborate?

I wouldn't say that it's a transition because I work as an illustrator but I love cinema, these are two different parts of my life. Maybe sometimes I can mix them, because I can do posters for festivals for example, and also for my festival. It's because I am a creative person, I love cinema, illustration and art in general, it's all in one place.

You mentioned your festival, the FEC European Short Film Festival. Tell us a bit about it.

We are co-directors with my partner, Sylvia Ferran. This festival takes place near Barcelona, sharing two bases: Cambrills and Reus. Every year, we choose the very best of the European short films. This is not a global, rather a European film festival. We screen about 150 short films, but only 30 or less are in competition. Every year we have about 7000 visitors in five days.

What is your main motivation for attending film festivals?

For us, it is very important to visit other European festivals, because we can learn from their management and watch films we could select for our own festival. And it also provides an interchange of experience. This is the first time the two of us are together visiting Budapest.

Sylvia, what is your opinion of BuSho's atmosphere so far?

Interview with Teréz Koncz, jury member

Teréz Koncz, hungarian jury member thinks that films are a huge inspiration source for her. After dinner, we had a pleasant talk with her, she was kindly answering all of our questions.

Are you a strict jury member?

At first, I want to watch the films through the „audience's eyes” and just go with the flow. If I cannot make a decision, then I see it through my „professional eyes”. Then I analyze the cameraman's work, the design, the editing, and try to see the whole picture.

Was there a situation where you watched a film and you didn't analyze it professionally?

Yes, when this happens, I say: thank you very much! These films are perfect just the way they are. Two-three films are like this, and here I just put a smiley face and write: Thank you.

What values are you looking for?

Well, when I became a part of the jury, I wanted to look for winner films. I don't want to analyze every film one by one, I would rather ask if it added something to my life or not.

How did these films influence you?

This is a huge source of inspiration, I can learn a lot from the others. Besides the fact that I have to take sides, it is a great gift that I can watch all of the fellow artist's films and I can learn from them.

Have you thought about submitting your own film to BuSho?

The next project that I'm doing is a 15-minute long film, I would like to submit it to festivals, like BuSho as well.

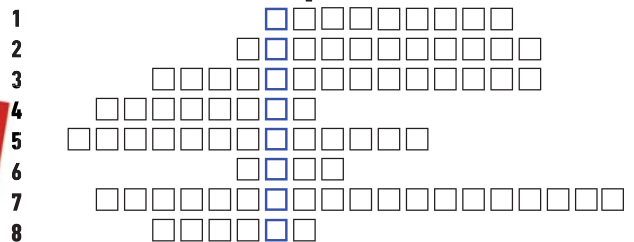


Boat trip to the Parliament

Interview with Nadya Bakuradze, jury member

After dinner we had a casual, friendly conversation with Nadya, member of the international jury from Russia, art director of the International Kansk Video Festival.

After watching all of the competition films, what is your general opinion about the BuSho festival?

I really like going to film festivals, because these are very special events for all the filmmakers. It doesn't really matter if I'm a jury member or even just a guest, I enjoy attending film festivals and watching films. It was a real pleasure for me, that I had the opportunity to watch this great mixture of shorts at BuSho as a member of the jury. There is a huge variety here, for example I noticed some films that I have already seen, but I've also seen new films that I can use probably for my festival as well. So for me, it was a really great experience.

What values are you looking for in films?
At the beginning, I have no specific criteria. I like to watch them from the beginning to the end, wait for the plot to unfold and to see the whole picture. Of course, there are some common things that I take in consideration: the lighting, professional imagery (a unique one that catches your attention), authenticity, good storytelling, and a lot of other things... Sometimes I just see that this director can do better and I want to support them. For me, this is very important.

You also have a lot of experience in organising film festivals. Will you tell us a bit about your festival?

It is a very-very strange festival, and of course it has a long story. If I told you the whole story, we would sit here until morning (laughs). It all started as a joke. We found a city on the internet called Kansk in Siberia. This has the same

pronunciation as Kansky. This city has no sea, no celebrities, no film – only video. It was fifteen years ago, when video wasn't as popular as it is now. So we started this whole festival in a small town in Russia in the middle of nowhere. This year we have the 15th edition – and from a weekend event we've grown into a 10-day long event. We also have editions in Moscow and last year we even went to the Balkans. **Can you tell us a bit about the numbers of your festival?**

It all started with approximately 200 applications, and now we have 7000 from all over the world. We have 35 films in the competition. The length of the films is min. 1 minute to 30 minutes. The festival is focused on experimental productions and contemporary culture in general. Our goal is to support video artists and independent filmmakers. We're trying to make the festival very interesting to the audience by organising other events: concerts, and poetry reading for example. **Thank you very much for the interview, we wish you all the best and success in your future projects.**

How did you become a BuSho student jury member?

The head of film department at our university recommended me this huge opportunity and I gladly accepted it, obviously I am very happy about it.

As a New Yorker, where have you heard about the BuSho Festival in Budapest?

Because this is my first film, I didn't know anything about festivals, I just asked one of my professors what I should do if I want to submit my film to festivals, and he recommended me the websites, so I did a Google search - how to submit a film to festivals.

So this is your first festival?

No, it's not my first festival, the first was in New York, a festival called the Big Apple Film Festival. After that, it was a Childrens Film Festival. It was really interesting, I wasn't in the childrens section, I was in a special one. So the BuSho is my third festival!

And what do you think about the whole BuSho festival?

I didn't know what to expect, but I like it a lot because even though this a competition, the atmosphere isn't very competitive. I was very shocked, you know, in a nice way, about the jury consultations. It is really nice, I like it, this is one of my favourite time and it is a good practice!

How many blocks have you seen here?

I think 6, I want to see as much as possible. Do you have a favourite film?

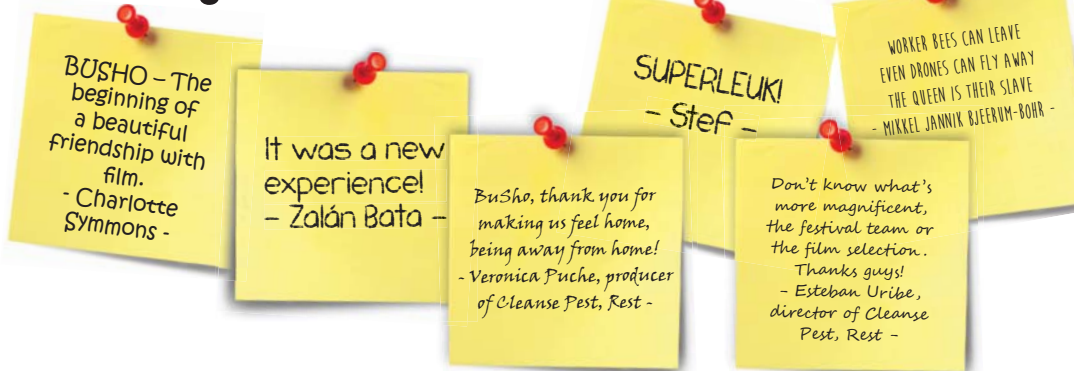

How did you come up with your film idea?

Well, for an artist, you know, it's always multiple things working in your head at the same time. [...] In the university I was in the slavic department, and one of the books we read was a little short novel about a girl who goes to the bathroom.. and after she comes back, anyone who sees her calls her shit head. And I was wondering if it was a mistranslation, cause in english it has multiple meanings.

And about the project: I had like no money, I was in school, and I really like to work with children, I like when a child is the messenger of the film, because I think that their reactions are very honest...
